1	Risk assessment and management is discussed and assessed together by service users and staff.	MDT discussions. Risk assessment audit. Daily notes. Nursing 1:1 discussions.

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6	Service users are involved in delivering, evaluating and improving the training around risk.	MDT discussions. Risk assessment audit. Daily notes. Nursing 1:1 discussions.	
7	Shared risk assessment and management is discussed in care planning, ward rounds, care review meetings and CPAs.	Evidence of discussions about restrictions on an individual basis.	
8	Clinical governance strategies ensure that risk assessment standards are reviewed, improved and implemented.	MDT minutes. Care plans. Ward round feedback. PBS Plans. Chain Analysis.	
9	Carers are invited to be involved in the process of risk assessment if appropriate.	MDT minutes. CPA minutes. Pathway mapping. START risk assessment. Collaborative Formulation. Collaborative Risk assessment.	
10	Community meetings discuss ward risk issues, and agree expectations of peer and staff interactions.	Community meeting minutes Agreed expectations.	

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
