











## Reducing Restrictive Practice Standards

1	 <p>Staff and service users meet regularly to talk about restrictive practice and the meeting is open to carers.</p>	<p>Meeting minutes. Involvement meeting agendas. Terms of reference.</p>	
2	 <p>Staff and service users have regular training about restrictive practice and it is linked with the Recovery College.</p>	<p>Training records. Induction information. Recovery College Course. Training material. Patients and carers involved in delivering face-to-face training.</p>	
3	 <p>There are ways for everyone to identify restrictive interventions, practices and blanket rules.</p>	<p>Community meeting agenda. RRP meeting minutes. Policies and Procedures. Security protocol. Clinical Governance. Carer events.</p>	
4	 <p>Reducing Restrictive Practice is on the agenda of established meetings.</p>	<p>Community meetings agendas Involvement meeting agendas Clinical governance agendas</p>

5	 <p>Conflict Reduction ideas are used to improve the wards and peoples experiences.</p>	<p>SafeWards initiatives. Positive Handovers. Ward atmosphere scale. Morning meeting agendas. RAID board.</p>	
6	 <p>Blanket restrictions are only used when absolutely necessary (proportionate, measured and justified).</p>	<p>Regular reviews. Audit. Ward expectations. Training records.</p>	
7	 <p>Restrictive interventions are reduced over time. For example: Observations. Seclusion &amp; segregation. Physical and medication led restraint.</p>	<p>Review documentation. Records from MDT meetings. Incident logs/ reports. Care plans. Low secure standards comparison. Peer review. CQC.</p>	
8	 <p>Restrictive Practices are reduced over time. For example: Communication and technology. Access to locations in building. Access to risk items.</p>	<p>Plan/ Strategy/ Framework in place – reviews demonstrate progress. Positive behaviour support plans. Individualised care plans. Risk management scores.</p>
